b. Geopolitical analysis

Despite recent economic growth, Pakistan remains one the lowest performing countries in South Asia in terms of the human development indicators. The persistence of conflict in the border areas represents a security challenge that detrimentally affects local populations. International relations

is also a persistent issue, specifically with regards to bordering nations India and Afghanistan – with whom Pakistan has unresolved border disputes and occasional military incidents. In February 2019 India – Pakistan relation went into critical state with both countries engaging in near-war airspace hostilities.

The country has a long history of taking in refugees: Approximately 1.4 million registered Afghan refugees are resident amongst host communities in Pakistan. Pakistan is regularly affected by natural disasters: In 2005, an earthquake displaced three million persons, and in 2010 more than 20 million persons were affected by severe flooding.

Economically, Pakistan is considered as middle-income and developing country. However, huge income disparities prevail. Inflation rate has been on the rise, causing decrease in the power of Pakistani Rupee and spike in key commodities prices, further exaggerating the differences between the rich and poor.

Presence of HI in the country

HI has delivered aid in Pakistan, starting from the 1980s to late 1990s to address the needs of Afghans refugees.

In 2008, HI underwent a strategic review, concluding that mainstreaming of disability in all aspects of life in Pakistan was far from being achieved. The Government of Pakistan also endorsed the review, and by signing the UN Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities, opened new doors of opportunity to address the shortfalls.

Since 2009, HI has been supporting internally displaced persons (IDPs) in the northern and southern regions of the KP (Swat, Kohat, Bannu, Di Khan, Tank).


During 2014-2015 HI implemented two short-term projects focusing on enabling access to basic life-saving services for persons with disabilities and the elderly in Bannu, Lakki Marwat and Karak.

In 2016, HI Pakistan has developed a 5 year Country Program Framework. The operational framework integrates and incorporates inclusive approaches focusing on the following five pillars:

- 1. Inclusive education (educational system is more inclusive for boys and girls and young women with disabilities)
- 2. Health and prevention (prevention and mitigation measures to effectively reduce risks and/or impact of impairments)
- 3. Relief and Inclusive Disaster Risk Management
- 4. Technical assistance to Pakistan Government and International Organizations, I/NGOs, CSOs etc., to ensure disability mainstreaming
- 5. Gender and women empowerment
